Jeanne Liotta makes films, videos and other ephemeral works including moving image installations, projection performances, and works on paper. Rooted in a cinematic sense of deep time, her recurring themes of the cosmic realities can be found at a curious intersection of art, science, and natural philosophy. Her signature 16mm film of the night skies, *Observando El Cielo* (2007), received numerous awards including the Tiger Award for Short Film at Rotterdam International Film Festival and was voted one of the top films of the decade by The Film Society of Lincoln Center. In 2013 Anthology Film Archives presented *The Real World At Last Becomes a Myth*, a complete retrospective of her works in film and video, and in 2014 she worked with NOAA climate scientists to create 360-degree media for Science on a Sphere called *Soon It Would Be Too Hot*. Her 2016 solo exhibition of *The Tiffany One-Cuts*, a series of 'one-cut' collages culled from the New York Times, was seen at Songs for Presidents in Bklyn NY and also incorporated into installations by artist Nancy Shaver at Derek Eller Gallery (2016) La Biennale di Venezia (2017), and MOCA Los Angeles (2018). In 2018 she installed her first solo exhibition with Microscope Gallery, *Break The Sky*, a 3 screen live video feed of the local cosmos as seen from Brooklyn NY.

Liotta's films and videos have been presented internationally at The Museum of Modern Art NY, The Whitney Biennial 2006, The New York Film Festival, Rotterdam International Film Festival, Wexner Center for the Arts, Cinema du Reel Paris, Haus der Kulturen der Welt Berlin, CCCB Barcelona, The Menil Collection Houston, and The Bard Graduate Center among others. Awards include NYSCA, The Jerome Foundation, The Museum of Contemporary Cinema, and The Orphans Film Symposium Helen Hill Award. Liotta has been a MacDowell Colony Fellow and a resident of the Experimental Television Center. She maintains ongoing research, programming and lecturing on The Joseph Cornell Film Collection at Anthology Film Archives and has written a short monograph on Cornells films published by The San Francisco Cinematheque for the travelling exhibition "Navigating the Imagination". She is presently Associate Professor in Cinema Studies & Moving Image Arts at CU Boulder, and Film/Video faculty at The Bard MFA program. Liotta is represented by Microscope Gallery, Brooklyn NY.
